







# Our Heritage

A new group of factories with more than 2 decades of textile experience have been combined together to become the gateway to premium quality Egyptian cotton to the whole world.



• Egypt Spinning and Weaving Company was founded in 1927 as one of the companies of Bank of Egypt, with a capital of 300,000 Egyptian pounds gradually increased to four million pounds in 1958, and the company is located on Talaat Harb Street in the city of Mahalla al Kubra in the Arab Republic of Egypt. At the time of its inception, the company contained 484 textile looms, now containing 5,000 looms, including 10 textile factories, consuming about 1 million quintals of cotton, accounting for 25% of the re public's total consumption. The company also has four garment factories with the production of 5.1 million pieces per year with 24,000 employees and 3,000 temporary workers, and the company has six vocational training






- Misr Spinning, Weaving & Beida Dyers Co. Kafr El Dawar is considered to be the oldest company in the area of spinning and weaving in Egypt. The company was founded in 1938 for the purpose of processing, dyeing, printing, ready clothing, and furnishings of 100% Egyptian cotton, imported cotton, and cotton mixed with polyester or viscose polyester, as well as a factory for preparing cotton and wool processing. The company started its production of yarn in 1939 through machines supplied by the best European and Japanese producers and consists of 4 production units, as well as production alone for thick yarns and alone for the production of knitting yarns up to 1/120 English, and also from mixed yarns, polyester, viscose, cotton, with a production capacity of 13,960 tons per year. The company also started with one unit, which now has four units, and a factory for the spinning of loads produced by all units. The production of spinning is 11,360 tons per year, up to 120 English, which is among the highest and finest in the world and is used to produce the finest fabrics worldwide.
- **Damietex** was established in 1959 with a capital of **600,000** Egyptian pounds and gradually increased to **1,590,835** Egyptian pounds. The company includes a factory for the production of cotton, dramatized and combed yarns, a factory for the production of cotton textiles, embroidery factory, and ready-made furniture. The exports increased in **93/1994** to EGP**65 million** against EGP**5 million** in **86/1987**.

• **STIA** is one of the biggest textiles companies in Egypt , STIA follows the Law of Business sector Company's No. 203 of 1991, the company was established in **1946** with a capital of 30,000 Egyptian pounds which has increased progressively the amount more than **45 Million** Egyptian pounds.



### The company consists of the following units all located in Alexandria City:

- 1. A unit for spinning, weaving and finishing worsted fabrics
- 2. A unit for spinning, weaving and finishing cotton fabrics
- 3. A unit for spinning, weaving and finishing carded wool fabrics
- 4. A unit for spinning, weaving and finishing blankets
- 5. A unit for weaving and dyeing and finishing knitted fabrics
- 6. A unit for manufacturing underwear and knitted garments
- 7. A unit for manufacturing bed sheets sets (embroidered, printed and yarn dyed), towels, table cloths ... etc).





## The New Era of White Gold

Since the dawn of history, Egypt has always been appreciated for its first-rate, superior cotton and weaving, tracing their ancestry to Neith, the Goddess of Weaving, in Egyptian civilization. Nowadays, Egypt is sparking a revolution in the textile public sector by investing time and money, marking a new milestone in the global textile value chain.

Egypt has pumped **21 billion** Egyptian Pounds into the development plan to increase the manufacturing capacity from **37,000** tons of yarn to **188,000** tons, **8,000,000** pieces of ready-made clothing to **50,000,000** pieces, and **50,000,000** meters of fabrics to **198,000,000** meters or about **200,000,000** meters per year, which is equivalent to four times the current product. Egyptian cotton is regaining its former glory



It is extremely essential to create an environmental management standard to follow the guidelines to be verified and certified for **ISO 14001**, **ISO 45001** for OSHA(Occupational Safety and Health Administration), **ISO 26000** for **CSR**, **ISO 50001** for energy, EMAS (Environmental management and audit scheme), **ECO TEX 100** will be contracted case by case as it should be specified regarding the number & type of product and the level of class (**I, II, III, IV**), **BSCI** (Business Social Compliance Initiative).







ECH pushes the limits of its capacity and can handle volume orders with ease. Powered by superior German machinery, ECH is capable of producing tons of cotton per day. ECH has been increasing its manufacturing capacity to convey volume orders of clients in a shorter lead-time. Having the world's largest spinning mill under one roof in Mahalla, ECH can successfully produce millions of pieces of garment per month as we have 654 Rapier New Looms and 464 Air-Jet New Looms.



### • Strategic Location:

With its distinctively strategic location having access to both the Mediterranean Sea and the Red Sea, Egypt has been a hub for trade routes between Africa, Europe, and Asia. Not only has overlooking the two seas made the country's maritime sector the most important in Africa, but also dominating the Suez Canal, connecting the two seas, has helped Egypt seize control of more than 10% of world trade volume.



#### Trade Agreements and Competitive Operations Cost:

The availability of vast quantities of raw materials such as oil, natural gas, cotton, and agriculture, as well as Egypt's strategic location along the Red Sea participating in East-West trade through the Suez Canal, have helped Egypt sign trade agreements with diverse countries shaping its ultimate cotton trading experience. Additionally, Egypt provides highly competitive pricing for unskilled and skilled workers for labor-intensive assembly and processing operations.

In addition, Egypt has inked bilateral agreements with several Arab countries, including Jordan (December 1999), Lebanon (March 1999), Libya (January 1991), Morocco (April 1999), Syria (December 1991), and Tunisia (December 1991). (March 1999). Additionally, in 1995, Egypt and China entered into a trade accord. Egypt has also signed an economic treaty with Russia. In June 2001, Egypt signed an Association Agreement with the European Union (EU), which came into force on June 1, 2004. The deal provided immediate duty-free access of Egyptian products into EU markets, while duty-free access for EU products was phased in over twelve years.
